The Hindu religion had sunk low at that time. It was full of superstitions and encouraged caste distinctions. Guru Nanak reformed it a great deal. Everybody was equal in his eyes. He did not believe in the caste system; he regarded it as a great curse. He said that no caste was high or low. He preached that there was only one caste: the caste of man. Hindus and Muslims were one in his eyes. He did not recognise them as Hindus and Muslims but as the creation of same five elements. He asked people to give up hypocrisy, selfishness and falschood. He told them that true religion was not in woods, in forests or in places of religious worship, but in the hearts of the believers. Guru Nanak's teachings are very simple, and they can be understood by the people. He preached in a language that could be understood by the people. He wanted them to follow the true spirit of religion. It consisted in oneness of God and devotion to him, simple and honest living, equality of all and purity of thought and action.
