It is like a giant highway that connects you to millions of other people and organisations located throughout the world.

The mixing of harmful gases and other particles in the air is called air pollution. Polluted air affects our health. Breathing polluted air can cause diseases and other health problems.

Some substances which cause air pollution come from natural sources. Dust, sandstorms, volcanic eruptions, forest fires and pollen from plants and flowers are natural causes of air pollution. Pollen irritates the eyes and harms our respiratory organs. The main cause of air pollution, however, are humanmade factors. Officials are supposed to be the servants of the public but their way of functioning suggests that the public has become the servant of the corrupt.
