Socrates derivation of the definition of courage was, of course in its details imaginary. But it illustrates the essential thing that made this enchantingly ugly and persuasive man, Socrates, a turning point in the history of civilization. He taught men that all good conduct is conduct controlled by the mind, that all the virtues consist basically in the prevailing of mind over emotion.
