(A) Make the precis of the following passage:

In some countries, rigid separation of powers has been effected by written constitutions. Take for instance, the Australian Constitution. Section 71 of Commonwealth of Australian Constitution Act provides that the judicial power of the commonwealth shall be vested in a Federal Supreme Court to be called the high court of Australia and in such other federal courts as the parliament creates, and in such other courts as it invests with federal jurisdiction. The high court shall consist of a chief justice and so many other justices, no less than two, as the parliament prescribes. The scheme of Sections 71 to 80 which form part of Chapter-III of the said constitution, is that the judicial power of the state can be conferred only on courts recognised by the provisions of the said chapter. In other words, it is not competent for the legislature in Australia to confer judicial power properly so called on any body or authority.

5 Gandhiji had to go to Pretoria. After the train has reached Pietermartizberg, a European passenger entered the first class compartment, in which Gandhiji was travelling.
