We are to consider the scope and purpose of the statute and in particular for whose benefit it is intended. Now the object of present statute is plain. It was intended to compel mine owners to make due provision for the safety of the men working in their mines and the persons, for whose benefit all these rules are to be enforced, are the persons exposed to danger. But when a duty of this kind is imposed for the benefit of particular persons, there arises at common law a correlative right in those persons who may be injured by its contravention. Therefore, it is quite impossible to hold that penalty clause detracts in any way from the prima facie right of persons for whose benefit the

statutory enactment has been passed to enforce the civil liability.
